## District Governor's February Message





# Constitution and By-law Changes

## Article IV- District Officers

### Section I

The officers of the District 14-G shall be the district Governor, who shall be the presiding officer, the first (1<sup>st</sup>) Vice Governor, the second (2<sup>nd</sup>) Vice Governor, the Cabinet Secretary, Treasurer, the Region Chairpersons, the Zone Chairpersons, District Membership Chairperson and the immediate Past District Governor shall form a cabinet of district offices.

### Section II

The District Governor, 1<sup>st</sup> Vice Governor, and 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Governor shall be elected at the annual District Convention in accordance with the provisions of the Lions Club International Constitution as provided for in Article IX, Section 6.

## Article V- District Governor's Cabinet

### Section VI

The cabinet officer's duties shall be in accordance with The International Association of Lions Clubs Constitution and By-laws Article X. In addition the 1<sup>st</sup> Vice Governor's duties will include the Chairmanship of the District MERLO team. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Governor will become the fourth member of the District Audit Committee.

## Article X- Dues

### Section I

Annual dues for District 14-G shall be \$2.00 per Lion member per the June membership and Attendance report to be paid for the following July-June Lion's year and collected by the Cabinet Treasurer. The District Governor will receive \$0.75, the 1<sup>st</sup> Vice Governor will receive \$0.75, and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Governor will receive \$0.50 for expenses or projects. The District Governor will set up a separate account for each Vice Governor. Payment will be made by September 1<sup>st</sup>.

## Article XIII- Convention

### Section I

The District Convention shall be held approximately thirty (30) days before the State Convention. The date is set by the Convention Committee and approved by the District Cabinet.

In the event that a Special Convention is required as indicated in The International Association of Lions Clubs Constitution and By-laws to fill or endorse a candidate(s) the District Governor shall set the date to conform to the requirements as set forth in either the Multiple District or International Constitution or By-laws. Each chartered Club President and Secretary will be notified by letter 30 days prior to the date of the Special Convention. Any District Convention under this Article shall be conducted in accordance with Roberts Rules of Order Newly Revised.
