“WE ARE FAMILY”!!! This was a song by Sister Sledge in the late 70’s. Does that apply to your Lions Club??? We as lions serve our communities and take care of those that need our help. We respond to any and everyone that requests our service, has a critical need, or is involved with a disaster. We send money to LCIF for earthquakes, floods, hurricanes, and tornados. But we often don’t consider a fellow lion as having a need. We need to consider that our club is also our lion family. We spend time with our fellow members, we eat with them, we work on fund raisers with them, and we work on projects with them. Some spouses think we spend as much time with the lions as we do our immediate family. We need to think that our fellow lions are like a family. We have disputes with our immediate family members, but always make up because they are family. We have happy family times and sad family times, but we are always family. This should also be true of our lion’s family. We should care for them as we would our parents, our children and our siblings. When a parent, child, brother or sister needs our help, we know about it and respond to that need. We don’t know or ask about our fellow lion members. Some help others when their own need is as great as or greater than the individuals they are helping through the lions club. Consider each member of your club as a family member and look to see what the needs are. When there is a disagreement within the club, remember to work to resolve the disagreement, bring all parties together to remain working toward the goals of the club which is to concentrate on the needs of the community.

BELIEVE that all things are possible, can be resolved and can be used to further the clubs service. BELIEVE that all members have needs and that as a family the club can meet those needs. BELIEVE that a club is only as strong as the attitude and caring of the members. BELIEVE with me that each club can be stronger, grow and do more service if we think as a family, act as a family, and treat each other as family.
